



#### Subtractive MonoPrinting

The Subtractive method means removing ink from your inking palette before you place the paper down to transfer the print. Once you have covered the entire surface of your inking palette in ink, you can use various techniques to remove the ink.



### Intaglio printing

Intaglio printing is the opposite of relief printing, in that the printing is done from ink that is below the surface of the plate. The design is cut, scratched, or etched into the printing surface or plate, which can be copper, zinc, aluminum, magnesium, plastics, or even coated paper.

Takes a different type of ink, stickier intaglio ink
